Now 24 years old, Young D.C. is the independent voice of young people (ages 13 to 19) in the metropolitan area. The volunteer staff strives to produce nine 16-page issues of the newspaper each year, but not all staff members work on each and every issue.

We schedule YDC meetings every second and fourth Saturday of the month at 1 p.m. in the newsroom. Please note that several SAT and ACT test dates fall on YDC meeting dates. Be sure to check with editors about possible rescheduling.

Visiting the newsroom on other days is encouraged. It has good resources and is an intern site for teens from high schools in D.C., Maryland and Virginia.

Young D.C. can be found in coffeehouses, restaurants, bookstores, libraries, public and private high schools, self-service businesses, print and broadcast media, non-profit organizations and social service agencies.

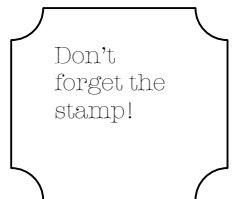
